AN ACT

AMENDING LAWS 2001, CHAPTER 236, SECTIONS 2, 8, 11, 13, 14, 21, 24, 27, 28, 29, 34, 37, 38, 39, 40, 49, 51, 59, 64, 67, 69, 70, 71, 72, 75, 76, 78, 80, 81, 87, 88, 89, 93, 94, 96 AND 106; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE DIFFERENT DEPARTMENTS OF THE STATE, FOR STATE INSTITUTIONS AND FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS; PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:

Sec. 117. Transfers of fund monies to the state general fund; fiscal year 2002-2003

Notwithstanding any other law, on or before June 30, 2003, the following amounts from the following funds or sources are transferred to the state general fund for the purposes of providing adequate support and maintenance for agencies of this state:

6. Technology and telecommunications fund (ADA 4201) \$4,000,000.

Sec. 122. Arizona telecommunications services

A. The proceeds from the sale of the Arizona telecommunications services central switching mechanism shall reduce dollar for dollar the \$4,000,000 transfer from the technology and telecommunications fund to the state general fund required pursuant to section 117, paragraph 6 of this act.

B. Before the sale of the Arizona telecommunications services central switching mechanism, and no later than November 1, 2002, the Arizona department of administration and the government information technology agency shall submit a plan for review to the joint legislative budget committee on any options, including privatization and allowing agencies to procure their own telecommunications services, that would increase the fiscal efficiency of Arizona telecommunications services.
